Fun and Interesting Facts About Dogs and Cats

If you think cats spend a lot of their lives sleeping, you'd be right. Cats actually spend 70% of their lives sleeping, which works out to around 13-16 hours a day.

Domestic cats are usually considered to be quite small and dainty creatures. The record for the longest cat ever is 48.5 inches—the tallest cat measured 19.05 inches!

Do you ever catch your dog staring at you? This might be because they want treats, want to go play, or they could be reading your emotions! Researchers have found that dogs are the only animal that can sense our emotions from a single glance.

Have you ever noticed that cats walk like camels and giraffes? Their walking sequence is both right feet first, followed by both left feet. They move half of their body forward at once. Camels and giraffes are the only other animals to walk this way.

Tail wagging is one of the best methods of communication between you and your dog. When a dog wags their tail, it can mean they're excited, but it can also have lesser-known meanings. While some wags are associated with excitement, others can mean fear, aggression or insecurity. Other feelings may include agitation, negotiation, curiosity, friendliness and happiness depending on the position and speed of the tail wag.

If you've watched your cat running around the living room you know that cats are pretty quick. You won't believe this fun cat fact. They can hit speeds of around 30 mph which is so fast that they could beat Usain Bolt in a 200-meter dash!

Cats put their best foot forward. Some cats can have a dominant front paw. There have been a few studies to show that females favor their right paw and males tend to fover their left.

Cats have a total of 32 muscles in each of their ears alone! This allows them to swivel their ears to hone in on an exact noise. All these muscles help cats rotate their ears 180 degrees.

It's no secret that canines are expert sniffers. The reason a dog's sense of smell is 10,000-100,000 stronger than humans is because they have over 300 million olfactory receptors in their nose. A Bloodhound's sense of smell is so strong that it can be used as evidence in a court of law.

Cats are musical creatures! Much like birds, cats make many different noises. Cats can make up to 100 sounds, whereas dogs only make 10.

Canines can sweat through their paws. Have

you ever given your dog a high five and noticed the bottom of their paw was slightly moist? This is totally normal. Unlike humans who have sweat glands covering most of our body, the majority of dogs' sweat glands are located in their paws.
