Fun Super Bowl Facts!

*Super Bowl games and festivities go hand in hand with fast food like chicken wings and pizza, making it the second-highest food consumption date following Thanksgiving.

*The Super Bowl attracts over 100 million viewers. Some viewers join the game through television, while others stream the game live. That's why using this platform for advertising is expensive.

*Attracting over 114.44 million viewers, the XLIX Super Bowl of 2015 was the most-watched game. The 2021 Super Bowl attracted 96.4 million viewers. It's the lowest watched Super Bowl since 2007, when the Indianapolis Colts played the Chicago Bears.

*The NFL claims to use Roman Numerals when naming the Super Bowl games for more straightforward clarification on the game. It also ensures there is no confusion. Roman Numerals were not used for Super Bowl 50. The NFL felt that naming the game with L might tone it down, thus affecting sales and attendance.

*Getting Super Bowl tickets can be expensive. It is no wonder most people just watch the game on TV. In 2021, a ticket to the event started at \$5,950. The first Super Bowl game was only \$12, and still, not all the tickets were bought.

*The New England Patriots and Pittsburgh Steelers lead the Super Bowl with six wins. Four NFL teams have never made it to the Super Bowl-- the Jacksonville Jaguars, Detroit Lions, Houston Texans and Cleveland Browns.

*There has never been a Super Bowl postponed, delayed, or cancelled. Even with the Covid-19 Pandemic, the Super Bowl was played.

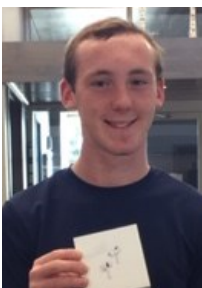
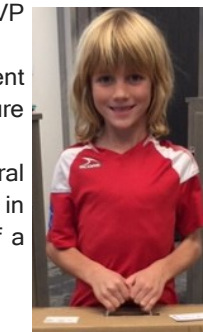
*Tom Brady is the most decorated player and the most successful quarterback in the Super Bowl. He has five MVPs and has won seven Super Bowl games. Joe Montana has been in four Super Bowls in 1982, 1985, 1989 and 1990 and has won all four games. He was the first player ever to be named Super Bowl MVP three times.

*For some reason, no sitting American president has attended the Super Bowl, but they all ensure that they watch the game.

*The Kansas City Chiefs played in the inaugural Super Bowl game against the Green Bay Packers in 1967 in Los Angeles. They lost 35-10 in front of a crowd of over 60,000 fans.

The team was originally established in Dallas where they were named the Texans; in 1963 they relocated to Kansas City since they couldn't compete with the Dallas Cowboys who also called the city home at the time.

*For the fourth time, the Super Bowl will be played in the desert in 2023. Super Bowl LVII will be played inside State Farm Stadium in Glendale, Arizona. The game will kick off on Sunday, Feb. 12, 2023, with basic ticket prices starting at \$4887 per person!

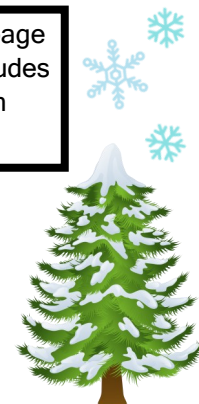

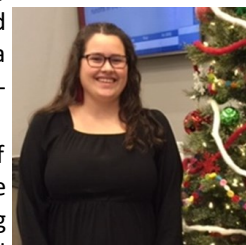
