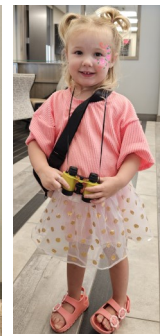
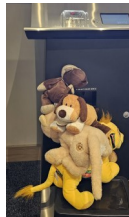

## It's a Scam!

If someone you don't know is urging you to make a financial decision in a rush – it's a scam! If something seems too good to be true – it's a scam! If you get a call from a "tech company" wanting to "fix" your computer – it's a scam! If you are given directions from the "tech" on what to tell your financial institution – it's a scam! If you are asked to "not tell" your financial institution and the request reduces you to lying – it's a scam! If you are given directions to make a cash deposit into a bitcoin ATM – it's a scam! If you get a call from your credit card issuer, bank or credit union asking for your account information – it's a scam!

These are all attempts to get you to hand over sensitive information. Never give anyone your social security number! The IRS, banks, credit unions or utility companies will never request payment in the form of a gift card. And of course, your bank or credit union already has your personal information.

If you receive a call and aren't sure if the company or person you're speaking to is legitimate, hang up and look for a verified number on the company website.



Scammers will apply pressure by saying your account is compromised– they might threaten legal action or threaten to cut off your services. Tell a friend or family member before making any financial decisions. Always be alert! Especially be aware if a transaction or investment involves cryptocurrency. Also– do not give anyone cash who asks for it to be deposited into a bitcoin ATM!
