"Jingle Bells" was originally a Thanksgiving song—James Pierpoint composed "One Horse Open Sleigh" in 1857 for children celebrating Thanksgiving. It was such a hit that it was sung again at Christmas and the tradition stuck. The title was changed two years later to "Jingle Bells."
